COMMITTEE ON TRANSLATION AND REVISION OF CONFESSIONAL AND LITURGICAL FORMS

Liturgical Forms - Introductory Remarks Mandate

Synod 1977, while giving with respect to the Creeds only mandate to provide a more modern translation, set some precedents as to how the Committee should understand its task re: the Liturgical Forms.

- It adopted 'provisionally' a Form for the Ordination of Missionaries, which is a translation of the one adopted by the Dutch sister-churches, thus benefitting from what was done in the Netherlands.
- It obviously took into account objections and/or wishes from the churches regarding some Liturgical Forms, like the one for the Holy Supper, and the Marriage Form. A <u>revision</u> of these Forms was considered desirable.
- 3. Thus, in its mandate, Synod 1977 mentioned revision in addition to the updating of the language, while reminding us of what had been accomplished in the Netherlands with respect to the Form for the Ordination of Missionaries. The Committee thankfully made use of this 'room' for revision, as will become clear from the first results of our work. The new Dutch Forms, published in <u>Gereformeerd Kerkboek</u> 1975, have been consulted extensively and profitably, though not slavishly, as especially appears from the Marriage Form.

FORM FOR THE BAPTISM OF INFANTS.

This Form was maintained in its present set-up. One will find that the sentences are shorter. Also, though no new texts were added <u>in</u> the Form, several references have been put in margin. This may serve two

purposes:

1. to indicate that every part is solidly founded in Scripture;

2. to promote the study of this (and the following) Forms,

FORM FOR THE BAPTISM OF ADULTS

The same can be said of this Form. After some discussion pro & con a Preamble, it was decided to maintain it, be it then now as the <u>translation of the new Dutch Preamble</u>

- N.B. Re: the addition of the Lord's Prayer to most of the Forms (and Prayers), the Committee left this unchanged in the Forms and Public Prayers. We propose that Synod decide to:
 - either make the use by the officiating minister or elder optional
 - or establish that this Prayer should be said in unison by the congregation.

FORM FOR THE PUBLIC PROFESSION OF FAITH.

The Committee became convinced that for this occasion, so important for the candidates, for their parents, and for the whole congregation, we should have a short Form, and not just a list of questions with an opening and concluding clause. Elements of such a Form should be:

expression of our gratitude for the faithfulness of our Father,
Who brought our children this far;

2. evidence that profession of faith is Biblical;

a charge to the candidates to commit their lives to the Lord;
a prayer of thanksgiving.

N.B. To the first question was added, " and do you reject all heresies and errors conflicting with God's Word?"

We propose as names for the Forms for Excommunication and readmission 1. FORM FOR EXCOMMUNICATION OF COMMUNICANT MEMBERS

2. FORM FOR EXCOMMUNICATION OF MEMBERS BY BAPTISM

Synod 1977 decided to add a "First Admonition" which will appear in the renovated Form.

3. FORM FOR RE-ADMISSION INTO THE CHURCH OF CHRIST

These Forms will be submitted as soon as possible.

FORM FOR THE ORDINATION OF MISSIONARIES.

Synod 1977 adopted, with minor changes, a translation of the newly adopted Form of the Dutch sister-churches.

This translation will be checked.

The Committee hopes to submit a revision of the Form for the Ordination of Ministers and the Form for the Ordination of Elders and Deacons later on.

FORM FOR THE SOLEMNIZATION OF MARRIAGE

This Form is a Translation and Revision of the new Dutch Form.

FORM FOR THE BAPTISM OF INFAMTS

When we are baptized into the Name of the Son, God the Son promises us that He washes us in His blood cleanses us from all our sins and unites us with Him in His death and resurrection. Thus we are freed from our sins and counted righteous before God.

When we are baptized into the Name of the Holy Spirit, God the

Holy Spirit assures us by this sacrament that He will dwell in us, make us living members of Christ and partakers of what we

have in Christ, namely the cleansing from our sins and the

daily renewal of our lives till we shall finally be presented

Eph.5:27 without spot among the assembly of God's elect in life eternal. Third.

Rom.8:5

Since every covenant contains two parts, we are, through baptism, called and obliged by the LORD to a new obedience. We are to cleave to this One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; to trust Matt.22:37 in Him and love Him with our whole heart, soul and mind, and 1 John 2:15 with all our strength. We must not love the world but put off Eph. 4:22 Col.3:5 our old nature and lead a God-fearing life.

> And if we sometimes through weakness fall into sins, we need not despair of God's mercy nor continue in sin because baptism is a seal and trustworthy testimony that we have an eternal covenant with God.

Although our children do not yet understand all this, we may rhave not exclude them from baptism. Just as they without their knowledge share in the condemnation of Adam, so they, without their knowledge, are received unto grace in Christ.

For the LORD spoke to Abraham, the Father of all believers,

- Gen. 17:7 and thus also speaks to us and our children, <u>I will establish</u> <u>My covenant between Me and you and your descendants after you</u> <u>throughout their generations</u>, for an everlasting covenant, <u>to</u> <u>be God to you and to your descendants after you</u>.
- Acts 2:39 Peter also testifies this when he says, <u>For the promise is to</u> <u>you and to your children, and to all that are far off, everyone</u> whom the LORD our God calls to Him.

In the old dispensation God, therefore, commanded to circumcise infants; this circumcision was a seal of the covenant and of Rom. 4:13 the righteousness of faith.

Mark 10:16 Christ Himself took them in His arms and blessed them, laying His hands upon them.

In the new dispensation baptism has come in the place of Col.2:11 circumcision. Infants must, therefore, be baptized as heirs of the kingdom of God and of His covenant. As the children grow up, their Parents are (in) duty bound to instruct them in these things. as they grow up;

> In order that we may now administer this holy sacrament of God to His glory, for our comfort and to the upbuilding of the congregation, let us call upon His holy Name.

Address to the Parents

First,

You have heard that baptism is an ordinance of the LORD our God to seal to us and our children His covenant; we must, therefore, use this sacrament for that purpose and not out of custom or superstition.

That it may be clear then that you desire baptism for the right purpose, you are to answer sincerely the following questions. do you confess that our children, though conceived and born in sin, and therefore subject to all sorts of misery, even to condemnation, are sanctified in Christ and thus as members of His church ought to be baptized?

Second, do you confess that the doctrine of the Old and the New Testament, summarized in the Apostles' Creed and taught here in this Christian church, is the true and complete doctrine of salvation? Third, do you promise as father and mother to instruct your child in this doctrine and to have him (her) instructed therein to the

> utmost of your power? What is your answer?

Answer I do (to be given by each parent).

<u>Baptism</u> (given name(s) and family name) I baptize you into the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer of Thanksgiving

(Those who were not baptized in their infancy, and at a later age declare to desire the christian baptism, must first be thoroughly instructed in the essentials of the christian doctrine. After having confessed this doctrine before the overseers, they shall be admitted to the public profession of their faith and to baptism. For the administration of their baptism the following Form shall be used).

Although the children of believers are not able to understand these things, they must be baptized by virtue of the Covenant. Adults, however, may not be baptized unless they, conscious of their sins, repent and profess their faith in Christ. For this reason John the Baptist, following the command of God, Mark 1:4,5 preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins

Luke 3:3

and only those who confessed their sins were baptized. Our Lord Jesus Christ also commanded His apostles to go and

Mat. 28:19 make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit; He added Mark 16:16 the promise, He who believes and is baptized will be saved. Acts 2:38,41According to this rule the apostles baptized only those adults 8:36,37; 10:47,48 16:14,15, who had made confossion of their repentance and faith. Therefore today also no other adults should be baptized except 31-33

those who have learned to understand, by the preaching and instruction of the Gospel, the glorious contents of holy baptism, and are thus able to give account of their faith by personal profession.

Aim at righteousness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness, Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called, when you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus who in His testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ.
