New Westminster - 1971.

Esteemed Brethren,

As of September 15, 1969, our duties as Deputies ad Art. 19 C.O., General Fund, have been finished. Deputies held one meeting in January 1969. No other students requested for aid. There was still one brother who received support until September 15, 1969. The money came in very regular this time, so that I could remit the aid in time. The brother was very thankful for our help, which he expressed in a letter dated September 7, 1969 and in which letter he asked me to convey this thanksgiving to the other deputies.

Our last report to the General Synod of Orangeville was dated October 15, 1968 and the enclosing financial statement was also up to that date. Following is a financial report of what happened after October 15, 1968 and the Balance of the Fund at April 1, 1971.
